Old Testament Lesson: Joel 2:1-2, 12-17 (NRSV)

Leader: Blow the trumpet in Zion; sound the alarm on my holy

mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the

day of the Lord is coming, it is near ...

Men: ... a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick

darkness! Like blackness spread upon the mountains a great and powerful army comes; their like has never been from of

old, nor will be again after them in ages to come.

Women: Yet even now, says the Lord, RETURN TO ME with all your

heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing. RETURN TO the Lord, your

God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing.

Leader: Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a

blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for

the Lord, your God?

ALL: Blow the trumpet in Zion; sanctify a fast; call a solemn

assembly; gather the people. Sanctify the congregation; assemble the aged; gather the children, even infants at the breast. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her canopy. Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, weep. Let them say, "Spare your people, O Lord, and do not make your heritage a mockery, a byword among the nations. Why should it be said among the peoples,

"Where is their God?' "

Leader: Worship the Lord your God.

ALL: Together, let us worship God! Let our hearts be renewed in this

time of worship.

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- Depth of mercy! Can there be mercy still reserved for me? Can my God His wrath forbear, me, the chief of sinners, spare?
- 2. I have long withstood His grace, long provoked Him to His face, would not hearken to His calls, grieved Him by a thousand falls.
- 3. I my Master have denied, I afresh have crucified, oft profaned His hallowed name, put Him to an open shame.
- 4. There for me the Saviour stands, shows His wounds and spreads His hands. God is love! I know, I feel; Jesus weeps and loves me still.
- 5. Now incline me to repent, let me now my sins lament, now my foul revolt deplore, weep, believe, and sin no more.

Let us now together reflect on our relationship with the Lord ... whether we have strayed from Him ... thus the need to repent and to return to Him ... thus being prepared for the "Day of the Lord" ...

- 1. Do we know the God who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love?
- 2. What do we need / repent of knowing that the day of the Lord is near?
- 3. What is our motivation for repentance ... so as to experience the Lord who relents from punishing?
- 4. How can we encourage each other to prepare for the day of the Lord?

Time to reflect on our relationship with the Lord

ASH WEDNESDAY ... the start of the season of Lent, a 40 day period of time, not including Sundays, that is designed to be an intense time of SELF-REFLECTION AND INTROSPECTION ... reminds us of the time that Jesus spent in the wilderness following his baptism, described in the gospels as a time of trial and testing ... seeks to strip us down, ... removes those distractions in our lives, ... helps us focus our attention on what really matters in our lives – the very condition of our souls ... to ensure we store our treasures in heaven. Gospel Lesson Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21 (NRSV)

Leader: "Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be

seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in

heaven.

Men: "So whenever you GIVE ALMS, do not sound a trumpet before

you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your

alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in

secret will reward you.

Women: "And whenever you PRAY, do not be like the hypocrites; for

they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will

reward you.

Left: "And whenever you FAST, do not look dismal, like the

hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in

secret will reward you.

Right: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where

moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be

also.

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- 1. Breathe on me, Breath of God, fill me with life anew, that I may love what Thou dost love, and do what Thou wouldst do.
- 2. Breathe on me, Breath of God, until my heart is pure, until with Thee I will one will, to do and to endure.
- 3. Breathe on me, Breath of God, till I am wholly Thine, till all this earthly part of me glows with Thy fire divine.
- 4. Breathe on me, Breath of God, so shall I never die, but live with Thee the perfect life of Thine eternity.

Let us now together reflect on our "spiritual disciplines" (charitable deeds / prayer / fasting / etc) ... whether to grow our relationship with the Lord for the good of God's people ... or merely for "others to see" and draw attention to ourselves ...

- 1. Where is our treasure ... where is our heart?
- 2. Whom do we worship and serve ... how do we do so?
- 3. Do we "give alms", "pray", and "fast" at all? When we do so, do we do so sincerely towards the Lord or merely for others to see?
- 4. How do we view those who are seemingly different from us? Do we adopt a "better-than-thou" attitude?

Time to reflect on our relationship with our loved ones, and others

Scripture Reading Psalm 51:1-17 (NRSV)

Leader: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love;

according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

Men: Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever

before me. Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment. Indeed, I

was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me.

Women:

You desire truth in the inward being; therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart. Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. Ash Wednesday marks the first day of Lent. It is so called from the custom in the ancient church marking the foreheads of worshippers with ashes. The appointment of Ash Wednesday as the first day of Lent occurred sometime in the seventh century and the custom of imposing ashes upon the congregation probably from sometime in the eighth century. In the early church, Christians who had fallen into grave sin were admitted to the "order of penitents" to do their penance so that they could be reconciled to the church during Holy Week, ready for their Easter Communion. The widespread use of this form of public penance decreased in the early Middle Ages, but the ceremonies associated with it ~ notably the ashes ~ were extended to the whole congregation. The ashes are placed on the foreheads of the worshippers with the words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."
